Specific topics that will be covered at this year's conference include:



Use of Video in Law Enforcement – Processes, Legal and Procedures

Ken Katsaris will present on the litigation, legal and internal investigation considerations concerning video. This emerging topic focuses on the use of in-car cameras, archiving procedures, new legal decisions, use-of-force review, and the use of video by officers for their personal evidence. Located in Tallahassee Florida, Mr. Katsaris has been a friend and supporter of Law Enforcement for over 30 years. He maintains his current sworn active duty commission with the Leon County Sheriff's Office and currently is the senior instructor for the Americans for Effective Law Enforcement (AELE), and has testified as an expert in police procedures in all 50 states.

Considerations for the Deployment and Return of Combat Veterans

A cadre of presenters from the Department of Veterans' Affairs will provide insight into the mental health, medical, and psychosocial factors that place individuals, especially veterans, at risk for suicidal ideation and behavior, how to identify warning signs and appropriate responses to suicidal ideation to ensure safe intervention and treatment, guidance to establish a safety plan, learn about the military culture, effects of traumatic stress from combat and ways to manage their important return and integration into our law enforcement community.

Legal Update for Law Enforcement Pursuits

Terry Armitage, Deputy Attorney General for the state of Wyoming, will present on the most recent Supreme Court decisions as well as Wyoming Supreme Court decisions on the subject of Law Enforcement vehicle pursuits from cases he has personally handled. Mr. Armitage will discuss nationwide trends and the elements of a good agency policy by discussing individual, department and entity liability.

Legal Issues for Internal Investigations

Terry Armitage, Deputy Attorney General for the state of Wyoming, will present on the successes and pitfalls of conducting internal investigations. Legal and procedural aspects of investigations, Garrity warning issues of compelled statements of government employees, criminal vs. administrative investigations, and several specific cases and examples for illustration.
