THE COOPER MODEL OF MODERN LAW ENFORCEMENT SEMINAR November 9-10, 2010

The new “cutting edge,” cost saving model, described in this 16-hour course, is a must for concerned law enforcement administrators, their command staff and their governmental executives, who are also urged to attend. The Cooper model combines five distinct and proven mechanisms to involve: the widely successful Six Sigma methodology, analysis of performance metrics, predictive analytics, spatial mapping and community involvement in law enforcement and public safety.

Topics to be covered include:

- 1) **Six Sigma:** The most powerful management system invented, designed to identify real causes of problems and improve them by elimination of process defects. Students will be shown how to use it without a great deal of math.
- 2) **Cooper’s Logistical Analysis and Statistical Systems (CLASS):** An innovative system, to collect, organize, summarize, analyze and interpret information useful for management decision making and deployment of resources.
- 3) **Predictive Analysis:** Methods to identify the crime problem and where it is trending, to calculate the probability of crime by type, location and by the perpetrator, to develop interdiction and intervention ideas.
- 4) **Spatial Mapping:** A forecasting model presented to calculate the probability an incident will occur between specific dates, times, days of a week and within certain geographical boundaries, which will allow remediation strategies to be designed.
- 5) **Community Involvement:** Presentation of a strategy for involving community members in enhancing law enforcement security asset protection, and applying the same strategy in neighborhoods to assist law enforcement in reducing crime and activity levels.

Your instructor, William Cooper is a 30 year veteran of Law Enforcement, retired as Chief from a suburban Seattle-area police department, who holds an MBA and a second masters degree in Public Administration, is a graduate of the **FBI National Academy**, is the author of five books, including “Leading Beyond Tradition” which the original Cooper Model was based on, and is a Motorola trained Six Sigma Black Belt, who has successfully applied the Cooper Model in both the public and private sectors.
