## ELDER ABUSE TRAINING

September 23-24, 2010

(16 P.O.S.T. Credit Hours)

This course provides law enforcement officers with information and strategies to effectively recognize and investigate elder abuse cases by identifying the dynamics of elder abuse and conducting effective elder abuse investigations. It is built around problem-based learning which draws the experiences of the attendees.

The curriculum was developed by the Office on Violence Against Women, U.S. Department of Justice, National Clearinghouse on Abuse in Later Life (NCALL) and the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center.

This training is a general overview of elder abuse that builds on the dynamics of domestic violence and sexual assault.

- Recognize Abuser tactics
- Work collaboratively
